CLASSROOM PARAPHRASE: Ruth 2:8–9,14. Jewish Tanakh / Christian Old Testament.

- 01** R1. Ruth gathers grain left after the harvesters. Boaz asks her to remain near the women in his field.
- 02** R2. Boaz tells the men not to trouble Ruth. She may drink the water they have collected.
- 03** R3. At mealtime, Boaz invites Ruth to eat. She sits beside the harvesters and has enough food.

- 02 Evidence: R3 says Boaz invites her to eat beside the harvesters.
