Read the source

CONSTRUCTED TEACHING RECORDS: fictional Oak Street; dates are for comparing before and after.

- 01 Record A - 1980: Oak Street has a library, a bus stop and a small shop.
- 02 Record B - 2026: the shop has become a cafe; the library and bus stop remain.
- 03 Both records show the same fictional street.
- 04 These are written teaching records, not photographs.

Watch the reasoning

- 01 The shop is in A; the cafe is in B. That is a change.
- 02 The library is in both. That is continuity.

Point to the detail that supports the answer.

Which statement is supported by both records?

- 01 A. The library stayed.
- 02 B. The street had no buses.
- 03 C. Everyone liked the cafe.

- 02 Find one change and one thing that stayed.
- 03 Can the records tell us whether everyone liked the change? Explain or point.
