CONSTRUCTED MAP: a fictional community for practising location and a key.

- 01 This practice map has two rows and three columns.
- 02 A1 school; A2 library; A3 park.
- 03 B1 health centre; B2 bus stop; B3 empty.
- 04 The key uses S, L, P, H and B for these places.

Watch the reasoning

01 I find A2: top row, middle space.

02 The key says L means library.

Point to the detail that supports the answer.

Make a decision

Where would you place the library label?

01 A. A2

02 B. B1

03 C. B3

Choose first. Give a reason before checking.

The printed map record places the library at A2.

- 01 Label A2 and B2 on the map.
- 02 Add a community place at B3 and add it to the key.
- 03 Describe a route from school to park using the squares.
