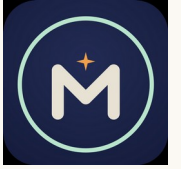


Build our community map

How can our labels help a visitor?

Contribute a labelled place and a useful note to a shared community map.

You may point, speak, draw or write.

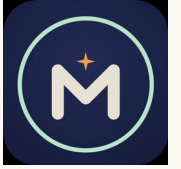


Start with what you know

Read the label library.

What note could explain its use?

Choose a map role: place, label, explain or check.



Words that help

KEY

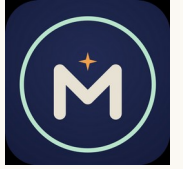
explains map labels or symbols.

Label: a short place name.

ROUTE

a way between places.

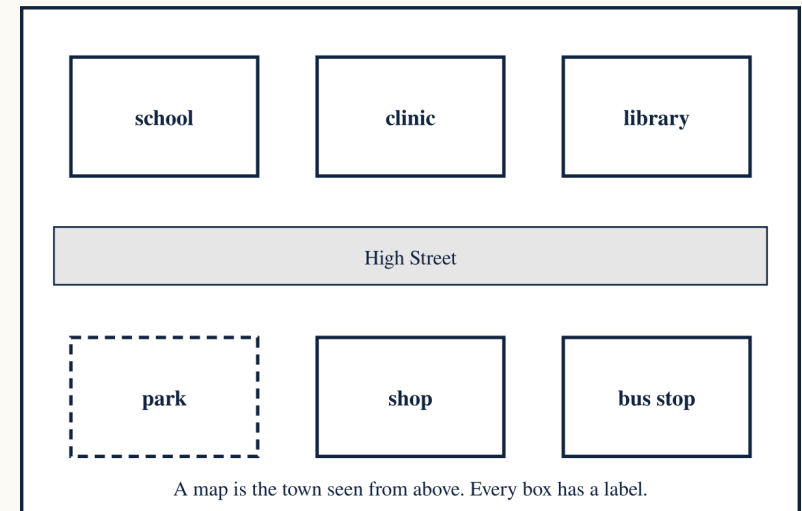
Note: extra information.

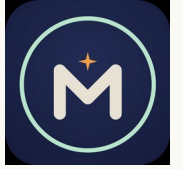


Make the map useful

Map A is a made-up town.

A visitor needs names and uses, not just shapes.





Watch a worked example

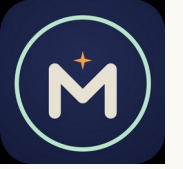
NOTICE

A grey box is a description.

Library is a useful place label.

EXPLAIN

Library: borrow books is a useful note.

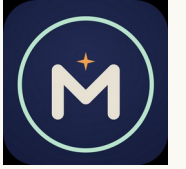


Try one together

Match: clinic, shop, park.

Use: health appointment, food shopping, play.

Check that another person can follow your label.

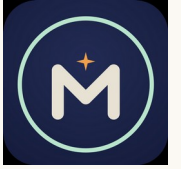


Choose, then explain

Which label helps a visitor most?

- A. The large grey one.
- B. Clinic: health appointments here.

Choose and explain.



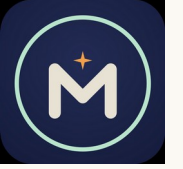
Now it is your turn

YOUR TASK

Add one place to the shared map.
Label it and add what happens there.

EXPLAIN

Ask a reader to test your note.



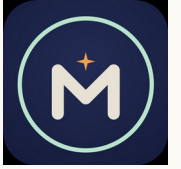
Show what you mean

Point to your choice.

Give one reason.

Your listener says what they heard.

Keep your first idea for the check.



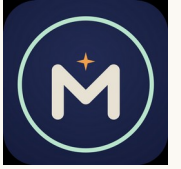
Check the reasoning

A LABEL

Names the place clearly.

A NOTE

Explains the use or who it helps.



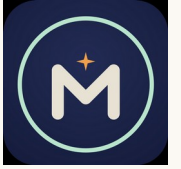
Your voice shapes the next step

Choose one idea to share, or pass.

Your listener tells you what they heard.

Keep or change your idea; give a reason.

Tell us what would help you next time.
