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M | Mary Seacole, 1855

Mary Seacole was born in Jamaica. In 1855 she travelled to the Crimea. With Thomas Day she established the British Hotel, supplying food and medicine and helping sick and wounded soldiers. The British Hotel was a business and a base for care; it was not Nightingale's hospital. Seacole later wrote about her life.
