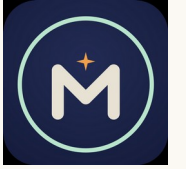


Source-based assessment

Use a detail. Explain what it supports.

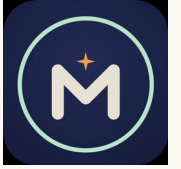


Start with what you know

POINT

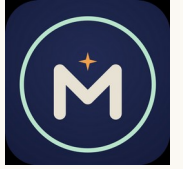
the argument you make.

Judgement: your reasoned answer.

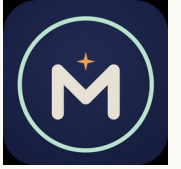


One image, different questions

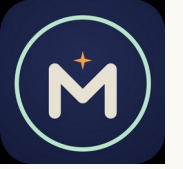
Know what your answer needs

Identify and repair four model errors.

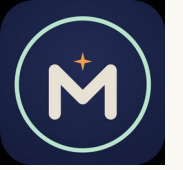


Try one together

The worked model stays hidden until you finish.



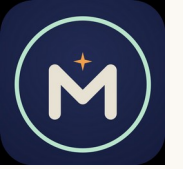
Choose, then explain

Your independent response

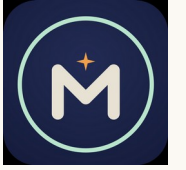
YOUR TASK

Keep your first answer before corrections.



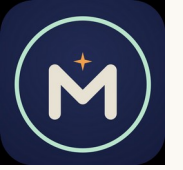
Now find and repair errors

Choose the most serious error. Explain why.



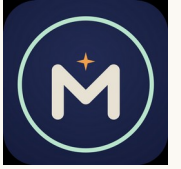
Check the reasoning

A modern summary is not a direct witness quote.



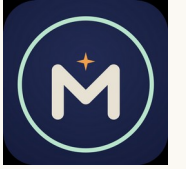
Your voice shapes the next step
